This is a generic list of things that are generally accepted as recyclable. **ALL** containers must be empty and rinsed of all contents. **ALL** cardboard boxes need to be broken down and placed in recycling bags that could be closed completely or call us for other options. If any non-acceptable items are in the recycle bag, the bag will be disposed of as trash.

### ACCEPTABLE RECYCLING ITEMS

- ✓ Aerosol cans (empty, no caps, non-hazardous)
- ✓ Aluminum cans
- ✓ Brown paper bags
- ✓ Cardboard
- ✓ Catalogs, magazines, and phone books
- ✓ Chipboard (cereal boxes, shoe boxes, etc.)
- ✓ Colored paper

- ✓ Computer paper
- ✓ Envelopes
- ✓ Newspapers and junk mail
- ✓ Plastic bottles and jugs (#1\* & #2\*)
- ✓ Plastic containers (#1\* & #2\*)
- ✓ Tin and steel cans
- ✓ White ledger paper

### NON-ACCEPTABLE RECYCLING ITEMS

- ✗ Aluminum foil
- ✗ Auto glass or ceramics
- ✗ Batteries
- ✗ Fluorescent lights
- ✗ Garbage (facial tissue, paper towels, and pizza boxes)
- ✗ **Glass bottles and jars**
- ✗ Light bulbs
- ✗ Hazardous waste
- ✗ **Medical waste** (needles, lancets, or catheters)
- ✗ Oils (motor oil, cooking oil)
- ✗ Painted wood

- ✗ Paper towels
- ✗ Plastic wrap
- ✗ Plastic coated paper (soft drink cups, paper plates)
- ✗ Plastic grocery bags (Please return to your supermarket if possible)
- ✗ Plastic cups (colored solo cups)
- ✗ Porcelain
- ✗ Scrap Metal
- ✗ Styrofoam
- ✗ Shredded paper
- ✗ Toys
- ✗ Treated wood

**NOTE:** Recycle must be placed inside trash container per Wildlife Protection Ordinance. Visit <https://estepark.colorado.gov/wildlife> to read the ordinance. Both the trash and recycle bags can be placed inside one container as they are sorted by type of bags.

- \* **#1-PETE** (A clear hard plastic often used as single-use food and drink containers such as water & pop bottles, vegetable oil containers, peanut butter containers, cleaning product bottles, and some prepared frozen food containers.)
- \* **#2-HDPE** (A hard plastic not as transparent PET that is often used for household cleaners, buckets, shampoo bottles, and yogurt containers.)
